Proceedings:

1. The chairperson of the Committee took the chair and welcomed the members. The members were all introduced to one another.
2. With a view to promote cross/interdisciplinary studies and widening the nature/scope of the School, it was proposed by Prof. C. P. Ravichandra that the name of the School of Languages be changed to read **The School of Letters**, as it has a broader connotation and includes studies in Language, Literature, Culture, science, social sciences, Area studies, film studies, Gender studies and related disciplines. The proposal was seconded by Prof. H. P. Gangnegi, University of Delhi. The proposal was unanimously accepted as a resolution and passed.
3. Professor Vyjayanti Raghvan proposed that the provision of entry and exit at multiple levels be introduced as part of the Five Year Integrated course offered by the Centre for Far East Languages (Tibetan). The matter was further discussed by the members and it was resolved that such of those students who exit at various levels as denoted here under may be awarded certificates/ Diploma/degree as follows:

After 6 months: Competence Certificate

After 1 Year: Certificate

After 2 years: Diploma

After 3 years: Bachelor (Honours)

After 5 years: Integrated Masters

It was proposed that the same may be applicable to the other two courses, viz., Chinese and Korean if the need arises.

The members also had elaborate discussions on how to develop the Tibetan courses to make it more contemporary and to generate more interest. Further they suggested the introduction of courses like, tourism, translation, etc. to provide for skill oriented training.

The Board members also unanimously agreed that to increase the number of students as well as to attract their interests in the programs offered by the Centre for Far East Languages (Tibetan/Korean/Chinese) the centre should take the students to field studies to forge a connection with the native Communities, Institutes and Centres. The field studies should be incorporated within the course content and credits should be allocated for it.

4. It was strongly recommended and unanimously resolved that the Centre for Far East Languages be **trifurcated** as three independent Centres **viz. Centre for Chinese studies, Centre for Korean Studies and Centre for Tibetan Studies.**

5. In view of the Work Load and the faculty crunch the Centre for Far East Languages is facing, it was strongly recommended and resolved that **a minimum of seven posts** be allocated to each Centre/Sub-centres under the School offering Five year Integrated Master's Program. The number of posts may also be increased as per the requirements.

6. In view of the increasing demand and critical nature of training in basic English competence across campus it was proposed that a Centre for English language be established under the Directorship and staff of ELT trained personnel. Such a Centre may train, whet thesis, projects and offer consultancy service within and outside the Campus. The staff pattern of Seven members and support staff as allowed by regulation was recommended.
