**Concept of competition:**

Education and communication play an important role in the development of any nation. Bharat has a unique education system, which from time to time, through external intervention, have been made to adapt it to other cultures. These external interventions almost ended the autonomy of education and the media inspired the adoption of the education system influenced by foreign education policy by popularizing it with the public. With time, the negative impact of education policies influenced by foreign countries was clearly visible in the country. As a result, the quality of education and the credibility of the media were questioned.

The National Policy on Education has taken a positive initiative to give autonomy to education. Autonomy is absolutely necessary for disciplined development. The more autonomous we make education, the more the quality of education will increase. Today, when education is ready to follow a national policy on the basis of autonomy, then we should express our views on various aspects of autonomy in education. The future of students and researchers will be decided through the national education policy. So, it is very important to know their views. For this, we can know his views by inviting writings on various aspects of autonomy in education. The views of students and researchers will be helpful in making the national education policy more effective.

We all have to make our views on any issue on the basis of the information received and the receipt of information is now getting maximum through the media. Therefore, it is imperative for the media to be autonomous in the real sense. Failure to do so may lead to confusion among the public about positive policies. The pressure of various political and economic groups on the media affects the working style of the media. When the media is autonomous in the true sense, then information can reach the public in an impartial manner. As a result, public opinion will be formed in the national interest with a fair attitude towards the national education policy as well as other positive policies. In this sense it is relevant to know the views on the autonomy of the media.

Last year, All India Research Article Competition was conducted through 'Shodh Prakalp' initiative of Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas. A total of 2168 registrations were received from 26 states. And, research articles of 1278 participants were received from 25 states. Out of 1278 articles received, 1128 research articles were found suitable for evaluation under the rules of competition. Prof. VK Malhotra was the chairman of the committee which was appointed to evaluate the articles for the award. Apart from first, second and third, 7 other research papers were also considered worthy of consolation prize by the evaluation committee. A total of 10 research articles were selected for the award.

Apart from the main topic, writings can also be sent on the following sub-topics: Autonomy in curriculum creation, autonomy in classroom teaching online education and autonomy, autonomy of teachers, economic autonomy of educational institutions, autonomy in exam evaluation, course Subject selection and evaluation, autonomy and transparency, autonomy and regulation, autonomy and responsibility, national education policy and autonomy of research, competitive examination and autonomy, media and economic autonomy, autonomy of media persons, media education and national education policy, media reporting and autonomy, advertising and autonomy, media management and autonomy, importance of autonomy in quality writing.

Research papers, articles and essays are also invited on other subjects related to the main subject.
