FOR 14th MEETING OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL
Held on 13th April, 2018

AC: 2018/14/001

To confirm the minutes of the 13th meeting of the Academic Council held on 03.08.2016

The 13th meeting of the Academic Council was held on 03.08.2016. The draft minutes of the meeting was circulated to the members on 19.12.2016 through email.

Prof. A C Pandey, the then Dean, School of Natural Resource Management has commented that placing the Centre for Environmental Sciences into School of Natural Sciences was not discussed in the meeting.

The minutes of the meeting and the letter of Prof. A C Pandey is placed at Annexure – I.

The minutes of the 13th meeting of Academic Council was also placed before the Executive Council in its 19th meeting held on 9-10 March, 2017

The Resolution taken on the minutes is as appended below:

The Registrar I/c summarized the matters as well as various resolution of the Academic Council. The Executive Council considered and approved the Minutes of the 13th meeting of the Academic Council held on 03.08.2016 annexed as Annexure-XVII with the direction/suggestion on the following agenda items of the said Meeting of the Academic Council:

AC: 2016/13/004: To consider and approve the draft rules on Admission Procedures for Undergraduate and Post Graduate Programmes in the University.

The Executive Council considered and approved the draft rules on Admission Procedures for Undergraduate and Post Graduate Programmes along with Ph. D programme in the University with a suggestion to include the reservation/relaxations in admissions for different categories, which shall be in consonance with the orders issued by the Govt. of India from time to time, is as follows:

Reservation & Relaxations:

1. Reservation

- a. 15% of the seats are reserved for Scheduled Caste candidates.
- b. 7.5% of the seats are reserved for Scheduled Tribe candidates.
- c. 27% seats are reserved for other backward classes (Non-creamy layer) candidates.
- d. 3% seats are reserved for the physically challenged candidates.PWD (UGC Letter D.O. No.F.31-1/2013(CU) dated 17th September, 2013)
- e. 5% of the seats are reserved for Children / Widows of the Officers and men of Armed Forces including paramilitary personnel killed / disabled during the hostilities over and above the sanctioned seat.

Priority of the CW of Armed forces are:

- I. Widows/wards of Defence personnel/Para-Military Personnel killed in action.
Required Certificate: Proof in Original.

- II. Wards of serving Defence Personnel and ex-servicemen/Para-Military personnel disabled in action.
Required Certificate: Original disability certificate clearly indicating the disability is attributable to Military Services.
- III. Widows/wards of Defence Personnel/Para-Military Personnel who died in peace time with death attributable to Military Service.
Required Certificate: Original death certificate clearly indicating the cause of death is attributable to Military Services.
- IV. Wards of Defence Personnel/Para-Military Personnel disabled in peace time with disability attributable to Military Service.
Required Certificate: Original disability certificate clearly indicating the disability is attributable to Military Services.
- V. Wards of serving Defence Personnel and ex-servicemen Para-Military/Police Personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards.
Required Certificate: Proof in Original.

- VI. Wards of Defence Ex-servicemen.
Required Certificate: Original ex-servicemen Identity Card/discharge book/PPO(Pension Payment Order).
- VII. Wards of serving Defense Personnel.
Required Certificate: Original Service Identity Cards and Dependant Card/Certificate issued by the Competent Authority

f. Two (02) seats over and above the sanctioned seats in each course shall be reserved for Kashmiri Migrants candidate as per letter No. DO No.F.1-1/2012(SA-III) 11th July, 2016

A certificate of competent authority for availing admission against Kashmiri Migrant Quota is to be produced by the candidates at the time of counselling/ admission.

g. One (1) seat shall be reserved for sports quota applicant. All the sports quota candidate may get additional weightage in CUCET marks as 15% for International, 10% for National and 5% for state level games/sports irrespective of number of participation (highest level of games/sports). Such candidates will occupy the category seats, if applicable.

2. Relaxation:

A relaxation of 5% of marks, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled and other categories of candidates.

AC: 2016/13/037: To consider and approve the establishment of Centre for Endangered Languages in Central University of Jharkhand.

The Executive Council considered and approved the resolution of the Academic Council and directed the University to submit the proposal to the University Grants Commission with a request to release the Funds at the earliest. The Executive Council also highly appreciated the Vice Chancellor for the initiative taken with regard to protection of the endangered languages, as per UGC letter.

AC: 2016/13/038: To consider and approve the amendment in the existing Ordinance on Doctor of Philosophy Programme (OA-9)

With the permission of the House, the Registrar I/c called the Dy. Registrar (Exam) to apprise the matter to the House. Dy. Registrar explained the matter regarding Ph. D programme, in detail and also apprise the Council regarding the proposed amendment to be made in the Draft Ordinance for Ph. D.

The Executive Council considered the draft Ph.D Ordinance for the award of the Ph.D degree in various disciplines and approved the same. However, considering the proposed amendment to be made in the Ph.D Ordinance placed as at Annexure-A, the Council resolved that the proposed amendment may be placed first before the Academic Council for its consideration.

AC: 2016/13/009: To consider and approve the proposal to repeal the Ordinance on the Establishment, Structure and Management of Centre of Studies in the University (OA – 3)

While discussing on the this issue, the Registrar I/c apprised the members that the Visitor of the University has suspended the operation of Ordinance on the Establishment, Structure and Management of Centre of Studies in the University (OA – 3) and therefore, the Academic Council resolved to repeal the said Ordinance and proposed a new Ordinance namely “Departments of the University Ordinance 2016” with amendment in the list of Schools and Departments. However, the University has already an Ordinance on “Establishment of Academic Departments/Centres (OA-1)” and hence, a new Ordinance on the matter is not required.

The issue was discussed in length and it was resolved that the proposal of Ordinance namely “Departments of the University Ordinance 2016” may not be agreed to and this may be sent back to the Academic Council for re-consideration. The Council further resolved that the Departments/Centres, which are in the Schools of Studies, may remain in the same School except the Centre for Water Engineering and Management, which may be placed under the School of Engineering and Technologies as the course structure and the degree awarded to the students are more relevant to the Engineering and Technologies. The ordinance on “Establishment of Academic Departments/Centres (OA-1)” may be suitably amended.

AC: 2016/13/013: To consider and approve the re-allocation sanctioned teaching positions from one Centre for another Centre.

After deliberation on this issue, in detail, the Executive Council authorized the Vice Chancellor for re-allocation of teaching positions on temporary basis, as per requirement.

AC: 2016/13/036: To consider and approve different issues of 4 years BA BEd/BSc BEd matter

Before taking up this agenda item, the Registrar I/c, with the permission of the house, called the Dy. Registrar (Acad/Admn) to appraise the matter before the House. The Dy. Registrar apprised the house regarding the resolution of the Academic Council on the matter. It is further apprised to the house that National Council of Technical Education (NCTE) approval was not accorded during the admission of 2013 batch students. Academic Council resolved to accept the recommendation of Dean's committee and accordingly academic council approved the credit transfer and arrangement of core and elective papers only for 2013 batch. Further, academic council also approved the award of the degree by respective Centres of Studies as per Dean's committee as well as expert committee resolution where academic consultant from NCTE, former director (ERC-NCTE) were also present.

Resolution:

After due deliberation on the issue, in detail, the Executive Council considered and accepted the resolution of the Academic Council on the matter and appreciated the efforts made by the University. Further, EC also suggested that the draft transit ordinance in the matter may be placed in the Academic Council for consideration.

AC: 2016/13/040/VI Remuneration for Ph. D. Thesis Examiners and for Experts of final Viva-Voce

The Executive Council considered the resolution of the Academic Council on this matter. However, the Executive Council authorized the Vice Chancellor to suitably decide to select the Evaluators, for Ph. D. thesis evaluation, within the Country or from abroad.

The Council also discussed the matter of honorarium to the distinguished speakers from abroad to deliver lectures in the University and it was resolved that the distinguished speakers from abroad may be paid an amount of Rs. 5000/- (Rupees five thousand only) for delivering lecture in the University.

The minutes of the 13th meeting of the Academic Council held on 03.08.2016 was enclosed as Annexure – I.

Number of Students admitted in various courses of study in the Academic Year 2017

Keeping in view the limited infrastructure and sanctioned strength of teacher in a Centre/Department it was resolved in the 13th Academic Council that the Five Year Integrated programmes may be discontinued and instead Two Year PG Programme may be introduced from the Academic Year 2017. Accordingly, the Two Year PG Programme was started from the Academic Year 2017. The number of students to be admitted in the courses was also discussed in the meeting of Heads and Deans and subsequently in the meeting of Admission Cell on 13.02.2017. It was resolved that number of students to be admitted may be reduced from 40 to 10 in each course of study except for Centre for Education where the number of students to be admitted was made to be 100. It was also decided that no admission will be taken in the Centre for Far East Languages owing to shortage of teachers. The number of students to be admitted in a course of study was later made to 14 to ensure the representation of all communities.

The minutes of the meeting was enclosed as Annexure – III.

The matter was submitted before the Academic Council for information and ratification.

Resolution:

The Academic Council noted and ratified the number of students admitted in various courses of study in the Academic Year 2017.

Number of Students to be admitted in various courses of study in the Academic Year 2018

The University introduced Two Year PG Programme was started from the Academic Year 2017 with an intake capacity of 14 students in each course of Study except for Centre for Education.

The number of students to be admitted in a course of study was discussed in a meeting attended by all Heads and Deans on 18.01.2018. It was decided in the meeting that the number of students to be admitted in a course of study will be as follows:

It is proposed that the University will take admission of 7 students over and above the prescribed number of students from the same merit list as paid seats (self-finance). The fee shall be 2 times higher than prescribed fee for the courses of Science, Engineering, Computer Science and Business Administration and 1.5 times for other courses.

The copy of minutes of the meeting was enclosed as Annexure – IV.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for information and ratification.

Resolution:

The Academic Council noted and ratified the number of students to be admitted in various courses of study in the Academic Year 2018. The Council further advised that the list be prepared School and Center-wise indicating the no. of students to be admitted therein.

Establishment of Dept. of Hindi

It was discussed and resolved in the 13th meeting of Academic Council held on 3rd August, 2016 that the Vice Chancellor will take steps for opening Dept. of Hindi.

The UGC vide its letter No. 14-1/2014 (राजभाषा) dated 14.02.2014 conveyed its sanction to establish Dept. of Hindi in the University with a sanctioned strength of 4 teachers (1 Professor; 1 Associate Professor; and 2 Assistant Professors).

Pursuant to UGC letter dated 44.02.2014, the Dept. of Hindi has been established and accordingly, the posts were advertised and an Associate Professor has already joined in the University and the recruitment of other teachers in the Department is under process.

The letter of UGC dated 14.02.2014 was enclosed as Annexure – V.

The matter was submitted before the Academic Council for information and ratification.

Resolution:

The Academic Council noted and ratified the establishment of Department of Hindi in the University.

AC: 2018/14/006

Establishment of Dept. of Computer Science and Technology

The UGC vide its letter No. F.1-1/2013(CU) dated 15.02.2014 conveyed its sanction to establish Dept. of Computer Science and Technology in the University with a sanctioned strength of 7 teachers (1 Professor; 2 Associate Professors; and 4 Assistant Professors).

It is submitted that an Associate Professor has already joined in the University and the recruitment of other teachers in the Department is under process.

The letter of UGC dated 15.02.2014 is enclosed as Annexure – VI.

The matter was submitted before the Academic Council for information and ratification.

Resolution:

The Academic Council noted and ratified the establishment of Department of Computer Science and Technology in the University.

Tripartite Agreement entered into between CUJ, UGC and MHRD

The UGC vide its DO letter No. F.13-3/2017(CU) dated 03.10.2017 informed the University that a Tripartite Agreement has to be entered into between CUJ, UGC and MHRD. The UGC also sent the format of the agreement.

The agreement covers a broad areas of academic, research and finance. It also contains the targets to be achieved by the University.

The agreement has been signed by the Vice Chancellor on behalf of the University and sent to the UGC and MHRD.

A copy of the agreement was enclosed as Annexure – VII.

The matter was submitted before the Academic Council for information and ratification.

Resolution:

The Academic Council noted and ratified the Tripartite Agreement entered into between CUJ, UGC and MHRD.

Exit option for students in Five Year Integrated Courses

The matter of exit for the students of engineering courses was discussed at various meeting of the Academic Council and resolutions were taken thereon.

The matter of exit for the students of engineering courses was discussed again in the 13th meeting of the Academic Council held on 3rd August, 2016 in light of UGC Notification No. F.5-1/2013(CPP-II) of March 2014 as notified in Gazette of India, Part III Section 4 dated July 5, 2014 and following resolution was taken:

“The Academic Council resolved to freeze exit option as well as lateral entry option with immediate effect for all the existing engineering batches as per UGC guidelines. Ordinance in this regard may be also amended to this effect.”

The above resolution of the Academic Council was approved by the Executive Council in its 19th meeting held on 13th April, 2017.

The students of Centre for Nanotechnology represented that since they have joined the course prior to issue of UGC Notification and as per the Clause 18 of the UGC Regulations 2014, their exit will be valid.

Considering, the provisions of the UGC Regulations, 2014 and the representation of the students, it was decided that the exit option is allowed for the students of engineering courses who are admitted into the course in the year 2013. For this, the students must complete the course with requisite credits upto 8th Semester and B.Tech Degree shall be awarded in the respective programme of M.Tech. A Notification was issued in this regard on 26.05.2017.

The UGC Regulations, 2014 and the Notification dated 26.05.2017 are enclosed as Annexure – VIII.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for information and ratification.

Resolution:

The Academic Council noted and ratified the Notification dated 26.05.2017 on exit option for students in Five Year Integrated Courses.

The decreasing number of students in Centre for Indigenous Culture Studies, Centre for Tribal Folklore, Language and Literature and Centre for Tribal and Customary Law has been a matter of concern.

The Vice Chancellor constituted a committee of experts in the field to review the syllabus of these Centres and suggest means and ways to make these Centres viable. The Committee opined that the name and course of the Centres may be modified in such a way that it should appeal to the students to take admission in these Centres and also the course should be job oriented. The students can appear in the NET/SLET and UPSC/JPSC etc. examinations by opting these subjects.

The matter was also discussed in great detail in a meeting with teachers of Centre for Indigenous Culture Studies, Centre for Tribal Folklore, Language and Literature and Centre for Tribal and Customary Law chaired by the Vice Chancellor on..

It was unanimously resolved in the meeting that –

1. The Centre for Indigenous Culture Studies, and Centre for Tribal Folklore, Language and Literature be merged and made one single Department namely “Dept. of Tribal Studies”
2. The merged Department will offer Two Year PG Course in Anthropology and Tribal Studies; and Folklore
3. The name of Centre for Tribal and Customary Law should be changed and made “Dept. of Contemporary and Tribal Customary Law”.
4. Dept. of Contemporary and Tribal Customary Law will offer Two Year PG Course in Customary Law & Tribal Governance; Law; and Human Rights

The copy of minutes of the meeting was enclosed as Annexure – IX.

It is mentioned that under Statutes 14, of the CU Act, 2009, the Academic Council is vested with the power to exercise general supervision over the academic policies of the University.

The matter was submitted before the Academic Council for information and ratification.

Resolution:

The Academic Council noted and ratified the merger and renaming of above Centres in the School for the Study of Cultures.

The University framed an Ordinance namely Ordinance on the Appointment of Dean Students' Welfare (OB-1).

The UGC vide its letter No. F.74-4/2012(CU) dated 24th July 2017 informed that the University may in the first instance frame the Statute relating to Dean Students' Welfare.

The UGC letter No. F.74-4/2012(CU) dated 24th July 2017 was enclosed as Annexure – X.

The University has now framed a Statutes and the draft Statutes was enclosed as Annexure – XI.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for perusal and consideration.

Resolution:

The Academic Council considered and approved the draft Statutes on Appointment of Dean Students' Welfare.

To consider and approve the amendment in the Ordinance on the Appointment of Dean Students' Welfare

The University framed an Ordinance namely "Ordinance on the Appointment of Dean Students' Welfare (OB-1).

The UGC vide its letter dated 24th July 2017 informed that the University may in the first instance frame the Statute relating to Dean Students' Welfare.

The University has submitted a draft Statutes in this regard. However, the present Ordinance is required to be amended to the extent as given herein below:

To consider and approve the amendment in the Ordinance on Doctor of Philosophy Programme

The University had framed an Ordinance on Doctor of Philosophy Programme. The Ordinance was amended keeping in view the UGC Regulations, 2016 on award of Ph.D degree and also in order to cover those matters which were not covered on earlier Ordinance.

Now Office of the Controller of Examinations has suggested that some existing provisions of the Ordinance are required to be amended to remove the difficulties.

The proposed amendments are given herein below:

It was also resolved in the 22nd meeting of the Executive Council that Hindi should also be included as one of the mediums of instruction and examination in the University.

It is pertinent to mention here that the matter of medium of instruction and examination was also discussed in length in the 13th Academic Council meeting held on 3rd August, 2016 and was resolved that "the existing Ordinance be followed. Further, as mentioned in this Ordinance "unless otherwise decided by the University", the Vice Chancellor is authorized to allow use of other medium of instruction as per the requirement, wherever applicable."

Keeping in view the resolution taken in the meeting of Central Universities Vice Chancellor conference, the resolution taken in the Executive Council meeting and the interest of the student at large, following amendment is proposed to be made in the Ordinance dealing with medium of instruction and examination in the University:

The University framed an Ordinance namely “**Admission of Student to the University and its Recognized Institutes**” (OA -13) dealing with admission of students in various courses run by the University.

The UGC vide its letter dated 24th July 2017 intimated that –

“Under Clause 10, University has not made any provision for reservation for OBC classes in admission. University may be advised to make the provision for reservation in admission as per Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in admission) Act, 2016. University may also make a provision for physically handicapped as per latest instructions issued by Govt. of India. Further, University may be advised to add the instructions issued by UGC vide its letter No. F.1/53/98(CPP- II) dated 20.04.2004 to earmark 5% seats for the children of Indian workers in the Gulf and South Asian out of 15% supernumerary seats for foreign students in university departments.”

“University may also be advised to add one more clause in Remittance and Refund of Fees in vide of UGC Notification on Remittance and Refund of Fees and other student-centric issues.”

Keeping in view the suggestion of the UGC and change in course structure of the University vis-à-vis filling the vacant positions, the following amendment is proposed to be made in the said Ordinance:

However, the Statutes 37 (2) of the CU Act, 2009 states that no Ordinances in respect of the matters enumerated in sub-section (1) of Section 28 of this Act shall be made by the Executive Council unless a draft of such Ordinances has been proposed by the Academic Council.

Accordingly, a draft Ordinance on Convocation has been framed and enclosed as Annexure - XIV.

The Section 29 of the CU Act, 2009 provides that the authorities of the University may make Regulations, consistent with this Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances, for the conduct of their own business and that of the Committees, if any, appointed by them and not provided for by this Act, the Statutes or the Ordinances, in the manner prescribed by the Statutes.

The Statutes 38 (1) of the CU Act states that the authorities of the University may make Regulations consistent with this Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances for laying down the procedure to be observed at their meeting and the number of members required to form a quorum (i). The sub-section (2) of the Statutes 38 states that every authority of the University shall make Regulations providing for the giving of notice to the members of such authority for the dates of meeting and of the business to be considered at meetings and for the keeping of a record of the proceedings of meetings.

A draft Regulations has been framed for the meetings of the Academic Council in light of the aforesaid provisions of the Act and Statutes.

The draft Regulations was enclosed as Annexure – XV.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for perusal and consideration.

The UGC vide its letter No. 6-5/2017(SCT) dated 19.01.2018 sent the copy of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 passed by the Government of India with a direction to implement in the University and furnish an Action Taken Report on provisions to be complied with by the University.

The following provisions of the PWDs Act are to be complied with by the University:

1. Section 32 (Reservation in higher educational institutions) – the higher educational institutions shall reserve not less than five per cent seats for persons with benchmark disabilities. The persons with benchmark disabilities shall be given an upper age relaxation of five years for admission.
2. Section 34 (Reservation) – every appropriate govt. shall appoint in every Government establishment, not less than four per cent of the total number of vacancies in the cadre strength in each group of posts meant to be filled with persons with benchmark disabilities under clauses ...
3. Section 39(1)(d) – provides for orientation and sensitization at the School, college, University and professional training level on the human condition of disability and the rights of persons with disabilities.
4. Chapter – III (Duty of Educational Institutions) - the Section 16 and 17 of the Act has provisions listed for Education Sector. The Act envisages provisions for ensuring inclusive education to children/students with disabilities

The excerpts of the aforesaid parts of the Act was enclosed as Annexure –XVI.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for perusal and consideration.

Resolution:

The Academic Council considered and adopted the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 for the University.

The UGC vide its letter No.1-1/2013(CU) dated 15.02.2014 conveyed the sanction for establishment of a Centre namely "Centre for Transport Science and Technology" with a strength of 7 teachers (1 Professor; 2 Associate Professors; and 4 Assistant Professors).

The sanction of this Centre was discussed in the 20th meeting of the Executive Council held on 13th April, 2017. The Executive Council authorized the Vice Chancellor to constitute an Expert Committee to suggest the course to be offered by this Centre, nomenclature of the degree and also the eligibility criteria of the teachers to be recruited.

The Vice Chancellor constituted an Expert Committee inducting experts in the field. The Expert Committee met on 19th March, 2018 and took resolution on course to be offered by the Centre, nomenclature of the degree and also the eligibility criteria of the teachers to be recruited.

The copy of the minutes of the Expert Committee meeting was enclosed as Annexure – XVIII.

The minutes was placed before the Academic Council for perusal and consideration.

The Academic Council considered and approved the establishment of the Department of Transport Science and Technology and minutes of Expert Committee meeting.

1. Department of Commerce & Financial Studies; and
2. Department of Ancient Indian History, Culture and Archeology

A brief overview of the proposed Departments is as given below:

1. Department of Commerce & Financial Studies

Modern business and commerce education covers diversified field of education and research in management, finance, marketing, accounting and commercial business law. In order to attain economic growth one needs professional economists and accountants with advanced practical training to evaluate and analyze the complexities of large scale finances.

The proposed Department with the objectives of promoting research, teaching and training in the frontier fields of Commerce. The Department will offer PG programme in Commerce, Finance and Management and other courses as per requirement.

2. Department of Ancient Indian History, Culture and Archeology

In an endeavor to further the holistic understanding of Ancient Indian Culture in all its parameters, the proposed Department of Indian Ancient History, Culture and Archaeology will provide a sound grounding in understanding the various vistas of our history and culture. It will help in promoting the conservation of our heritage and also help in heritage management. It opens the door to opportunities in the streams of Archaeology, Museology, Conservation, Social Sciences and Humanities

The proposed department will offer PG programme in Ancient Indian History, Culture and Archeology and other courses as per requirement.

The extract of the minutes of the Executive Council was enclosed as Annexure – XIX.

The proposal of opening the above two courses was placed before the Academic Council for consideration.

The Academic Council considered and approved the establishment of the Department of Commerce & Financial Studies and Department of Ancient Indian History, Culture and Archeology.

LOGO

The University has a Logo which occupies a very special place within the whole brand image building process of the University.



It has been observed that the Logo contains name of the University and the Motto of the University in only one language i.e. in English. As per the Official Language Policy of Government of India, the Logo of the University should contain information both in Hindi and English Languages.

Keeping in view, the Logo of the University should be modified/changed. The modified Logo of the University is as given below:



The Logo Colours

The three colours of the logo have been chosen with reference to what the ancient Upanishads have to say on colours:

Green: - Stands for vitality and growth and greenery of the region

Maroon /yellow ring: - Symbolizes existence and dynamism all around with simplicity and wisdom

Golden Yellow: - Knowledge, wisdom and prosperity

Wheat Crown – Represents the rich agriculture of Jharkhand.

Star – Represents the CUJ through agriculture, greenery and wisdom

The modification made in the University Logo was placed before the Academic Council for consideration.

Resolution:

The Academic Council accepted and approved the modification made in the University Logo with advice that the Star symbol be removed and there should not be overlapping of Wheat Crown with outer maroon ring.

The Council also advised that a “*Kulgeet*” be also prepared for the University and necessary steps may be taken in this regard.

To consider and approve the proposal of conducting Tibetan course for Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) personnel

The permanent campus of the University is being developed at Cheri-Manatu village under Kanke Block of the Ranchi District.

There is an Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) Battalion near the permanent campus of the University. The ITBP personnel are prominently deployed along the India-Tibet-China border. If the ITBP personnel are equipped with working knowledge of the languages spoken along the border areas of Tibet and China i.e. Tibetan and Chinese, it will be of great help for them in discharging their duties efficiently.

The University has a Centre for Far East Languages which offers courses in Tibetan and Chinese languages also. If University develops some short term courses for ITBP personnel, it will be a good effort in the service of the nation.

Keeping in view the significance of Chinese and Tibetan languages for ITBP personnel, the Vice Chancellor wrote a letter to the Director General, ITBP and offered that a suitable course can be developed for the ITBP personnel.

The Director General, ITBP, in response to the letter of the Vice Chancellor sought information on certain points viz., Duration of the Course; Eligibility conditions; Cost of training; etc.

The Centre for Far East Languages has now prepared a Short Term Intensive Course of three months duration in Chinese and Tibetan Languages along with eligibility conditions and fee structure.

The Course Curriculum and other details are enclosed as Annexure – XX.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for perusal and consideration.

Resolution:

The Academic Council accepted the proposal in-principle and authorized the Vice Chancellor to place before the Executive Council for their consideration.

A student shall be allowed maximum two back papers in total including the semester in which the student is currently registered or continuing his study. Further, student shall be allowed total three years to clear all the papers failing which the registration shall be cancelled. The maximum course duration as a non-collegiate student shall be for only one year over and above two years as collegiate student in a regular mode.

His pre-submission seminar for Ph.D may be held at the earliest before 10th of July, 2015.

In the meantime Dr. Sandeep Yadav joined back his parent organization i.e. University of Delhi. The Centre for English appointed a new supervisor i.e. Dr. Mayank Ranjan for Shri Ajay Kumar. His topic of research was partially modified and was made "Voices of Dissent: Imtiaz Dharker and Sujata Bhatt" and the same got approved by the Board of Studies, AC and School Board. Shri Kumar vide his letter dated 28.10.2015 requested the Vice Chancellor to arrange pre-submission seminar under the supervision of Dr. Sandeep Kumar Yadav.

Shri Ajay Kumar has preferred an application in the SC/ST Commission and has also filed a writ petition in the Hon'ble High Court of Jharkhand for submission of his Ph.D thesis under Dr. Sandeep Kumar Yadav.

It is pertinent to mention that his first Supervisor had certified that his progress throughout the PhD has been satisfactory. His pre-submission seminar for Ph.D may be held.

Considering the substantial work done by Shri Ajay Kumar including the publication of research papers, the suffering and financial hardship faced by Shri Ajay Kumar, the report of the one man committee and in the larger interest of the student, the Vice Chancellor decided that the decision of DRC/CRC/BoS to change the supervisor and the synopsis be turned down and the scholar Shri Ajay Kumar be allowed for submission of thesis under his first supervisor.
