AC: 2010/4/005: Free Education and/or vocational degree to the dependent children of Leprosy affected persons.

A letter of Mr. Renu Batra, Joint Secretary, UGC, New Delhi dated 10th June 2010 has been received regarding free education and /or vocational degree to the dependent children of Leprosy affected persons wherein it is mentioned that the committee on Petitions of Rajya Sabha in its 131 report had recommended that the Government should ensure education up to higher secondary level, free of chare for the dependent children of Leprosy affected persons. The committee had also recommended that Government should arrange vocational and degree courses to the dependent children of LAPs for their self sustenance in future.

In view of the above University has sent letter to the Registrar of all the Universities of the State of Jharkhand to take the feedback in this context. Out of which Birsa Agricultural University, Kanke, Ranchi has sent reply and mentioned that there is no provision/regulation in B.A. U. for providing free education and arranging vocational and degree to the dependent children of Leprosy affected persons. However, the matter will be put up before the next Academic Council meeting for consideration and decision. They have informed.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for consideration and advice Resolution:

The Academic Council noted the matter. As and when the Vocational training under the Extension programmes of the University start, the same could be included.

AC: 2010/4/006: Implementation of the recommendations of Group of Minister (GOM) on equal opportunities for disabled persons.

The director (HE), MHRD, Govt. of India, vide his letter no.- 1-6/2010-U.5 dated 21st May 2010 has enclosed a copy of the recommendation no. 17 & 18 and Performa for sending action taken report on the recommendation, on equal opportunities for disabled persons as per recommendation of Group of Ministers (GOM).

AC: 2010/4/007- Teaching and Research in Basic Science

An email dated 18th July, 2010 was received from Dr. H. Junjappa, working group member in Chemistry. In this email he has mentioned to reconsider seriously the naming of the different Science subjects. There is a strong need to train the young students in basic science in the proposed teaching programme to make them strong in the subject so that they are equipped to undertake advanced research leading to Ph.D and further. He therefore suggested that we may designate all science subjects in their proper names as follows:-

- 1. Mathematical Sciences
- 2. Chemical Sciences
- 3. Physical Sciences
- 4. Biological Sciences etc.

This is the most appropriate way to designate Science subjects to reflect on teaching and research to produce our young scientific generation who will constitute our future scientists and teachers. Similar feedback has been received from the Physics working group member.

In this connection it is pertinent to mention that our University has named Science subjects as follows:

- 1. Applied Mathematics
- 2. Applied Chemistry
- 3. Applied Physics
- 4. Life Sciences.

However the nomenclature sent by the UGC is following

- 1. Mathematics
- 2. Physics
- 3. Chemistry



4. Life Sciences.

and for which we have already requested to the Joint Secretary, UGC for change in nomenclature. The reply is still awaited.

A discussion on the matter was made in the last Academic Council meeting wherein the nomenclature was retained the status quo "Applied" nature.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for consideration and advice

The Academic Council resolved that the status quo should remain for the time being.

AC: 2010/4/008: UGC New Regulation on Qualification

The new regulation on qualification has been issued by the UGC and a copy of the same has been placed on the UGC website also. A copy of the UGC Regulation "on Minimum Qualification for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in University and College and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education 2009".

- 1. the matter would need to be considered by the Academic Council.
- 2. for the purpose of faculty selection the UGC criteria as per the New Regulation would be followed.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for consideration and advice.

- 1. The Academic Council resolved to accept the UGC Regulation
- 2. The Academic Council further resolved that a note to be prepared on the qualification criteria in specific subjects like Mass Communication, Fine Arts which would be sent to UGC for consideration.

AC: 2010/4/010: To consider starting of new programmes fro the ensuing academic session 2011-12.

The Central University of Jharkhand initially started 4 courses namely

- 1. Applied Mathematics
- 2. Business Administration
- 3. English Language
- 4. Mass Communication

Thereafter in the session 2010-11 year 6 new courses have been also started namely as follows:-

- 1. Applied Physics
- 2. Life Sciences
- 3. Applied Chemistry
- 4. Nanotechnology
- 5. Water Engineering and Management
- 6. Indigenous Culture

A vision plan for the early years had been presented and approved in the first Academic Council meeting in October 2009.

For information, subjects and programmes offered by the other new central universities. The University might need to consider the plan for the next Academic year 2011-2012.

A brainstorming session is also being planned this year for a detailed Vision Plan for the University for the next twenty years.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for consideration and advice.

Resolution:

1. The Academic Council resolved to express its deep concern in the delay of a permanent site being allotted to the University, thereby adversely affecting its proposed Academic programme.



- 2. The Academic Council resolved to consider to start new course depending on the infrastructure and available facilities.
- 3.The Academic Council resolved the M.Phil and P.G. Programme could be introduced when regular faculty members join.
- 4. The Academic Council resolved that studies on courses of Gender Studies, Comparative Literature, Development Studies and Education could be considered in discussion in the Academic programme of the University.

AC: 2010/4/011: To consider to establish New Schools.

Statute 15(1) of Central University of Jharkhand read as "The University shall have such School of Studies as may be specified in the Statutes." At present the Central University of Jharkhand has 7 (Seven) approved School in different disciplines.

Social Science subjects are being in the different Centre of Studies. A School of Humanities and Social Sciences could be considered to be established. Accordingly a Centre of Social Sciences could be considered under this school.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council for its consideration.

Resolution:

The Academic Council approved the establishment of a School of Humanities and Social Sciences. Accordingly a Centre of Humanities and Social Sciences could be considered under this School.

AC: 2010/4/012: To Consider to approve the revised draft Regulation RA(I) on Grading System of Evaluation.

The 2nd meeting of the Academic Council had recommended that the Regulation on Grading be revised after consultation with Hyderabad University. It's was done. The BHU was also consulted.

The draft regulation was placed before the Academic Council for its consideration.
